This competition is open to people of all ages and will be judged in three categories:

- 17 and under (parent/guardian consent required)
- 18 – 55
- 56 and over

The winner of the 17 and under category will receive a £50 high street voucher, and the winners of the adult categories will receive a cash prize of £50. Prizes kindly supplied by Ison Harrison Solicitors.

Please submit your photograph with a brief description (no more than 30 words), your name and your age category by email to dyingmatters@leeds.gov.uk using the title '**Dying Matters photo comp**'. Photographs should be submitted as high-resolution jpegs and must be no larger than 10MB.

The deadline for entries is midnight GMT on 31st March 2019.

Winners will be notified by the 30th April 2019 and all shortlisted entries will be on display at our Dying Matters event at Kirkgate Market on Tuesday 14th May 2019.

Photography Competition - Dying, Bereavement and Remembrance Terms and Conditions

The competition closes at midnight GMT on 31 March 2019. All entries received after this time will not be considered.

The competition is open to people of all ages and will be judged in three categories - 17 and under; 18 – 55; 56 and over. Entrants aged 17 and under must confirm that they have permission from their parent/guardian to do so. The parent or guardian for the winner of this category will have to receive the prize on their behalf and parental/guardian consent will be required for any publicity. Proof of age may be required. Prizes are a £50 high street voucher for the 17 and under category, and £50 cash prize for the 18 - 55 and 56 and over categories

Photographs should be submitted as high-resolution jpegs and must be no larger than 10MB. We cannot accept links to other file-sharing services or websites. All entrants are asked to submit a brief description of their photograph in no more than 30 words, together with their name and age category.

Entries should be submitted via email to dyingmatters@leeds.gov.uk using the title **'Dying Matters photo comp'**

All photographs submitted must be the work of the individual submitting them and have been taken in the last three years. With the exception of your personal social media pages and non-commercial personal websites, you cannot enter photos that have been published elsewhere, either online, in print.

It is the responsibility of each entrant to ensure that any images they submit have been taken with the permission of the subject and do not infringe the copyright of any third party. If the person in the image is under 18, or a vulnerable adult, then a parent, carer, guardian or responsible professional must have also given permission.

Copyright for all photographs submitted for the competition remains with the respective entrants. However, by submitting an entry to the competition, all entrants are granting the right to use and republish their photographs on all forms of media, and agree that we may cut, edit or arrange the photograph where appropriate in print or online.

We reserve the right to:

- exclude from the judging any images deemed to be offensive
- edit the text supplied with the image for the purposes of publication or exhibition, including edits for spelling, grammar and content length

The winners will be selected by a panel of independent judges. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered in to.

Winners will be notified by the 30th April 2019 and all shortlisted entries will be on display at our Dying Matters event at Kirkgate Market on Tuesday 14th May 2019. Entrants into the competition shall be deemed to have accepted these terms and conditions.
