Treasurer's Report

The financial position of Leeds Bereavement Forum remains healthy and stable for the financial year ended in March 2017.

Total receipts during the financial year are £41,933 against total payments of £40,473. As a result, there is a surplus of £1,460 at the financial year end, compared to last year's deficit of £2,353. This is mainly due to a reorganisation in human resources which reduces our overall payments in salaries and pension.

The surplus in net cash receipt this year increases our cash fund balances from £31,035 to £32,495.

Going forward, Leeds Bereavement Forum has secured sufficient funding from commissioning bodies for operation for the next two years. Our staff continue to support healthy financial functions and maintain a high level of commitment to provide services set out in our charity objectives. In May 2016 we launched our new series of free monthly Special Interest Group Talks.

Our first talk in May was *'Suicide and its effect on Children'*, other talks in the series include *'Pregnancy Loss'* and *'Digital Legacy'*. The talks have grown in popularity and we have continued to introduce new subjects into 2017.

Raising awareness

We held four Death Cafés during Dying Matters Week in May, three in learning disability-led venues and participated in the Dying Matters Leeds event at Leeds City Museum. In September in partnership with Full Circle Funerals, we introduced a series of four monthly Death Cafés, which were followed in February 2017 in partnership with Leeds Libraries with a series of five Death Cafés running across the city in different library locations. We plan to continue our Death Cafés with Leeds Libraries into 2018.

In June as part of Refugee Week, Leeds Bereavement Forum's annual conference examined how Leeds supports refugees and asylum seekers who have faced or are facing bereavement. We had a great line up of speakers and received excellent feedback .

In November, we ran a series of workshops with The

Grief Series during Day of the Dead week, funded by Sport Relief Community Cash. The workshops were well attended and held in a variety of community locations across the city. Working in partnership with Time to Shine project at Leeds Older People's Forum we introduced a new half-day session, *'Bereavement - a lonely place'*.

Throughout the year we held four *'Basic Bereavement Skills'* training sessions in

partnership with Leeds City Council, plus our bespoke *'Bereavement Skills for working with Children'* training course which we held in June for Catholic Care. We hope to expand our training provision further in 2017 by recruiting a new Development Worker.

Signposting support

We formally launched our new website and branding at our Annual General Meeting in November. Feedback has been really positive and has allowed us to reach a larger audience along with our use of Twitter and Facebook.

In December, in partnership with Childhood Bereavement Network, we held a free one-day conference for Leeds Bereavement Forum members, *‘Supporting children before a death - and supporting your service.’* which again received excellent feedback.

Working across the city

We continue to chair the quarterly Leeds Citywide Bereavement Meetings, partners include St Gemma’s Hospice, Wheatfields Hospice, Carers Leeds and Cruse Bereavement Care. The Forum is also a key stakeholder on Leeds City Council Bereaved Children and Young People’s Steering group and Leeds Suicide Bereavement Service

Steering Group.

Working in partnership with Leeds City Museum we held a series of events between December 2016 and July 2017 to coincide with their Dying Matters Community Display. The exhibition was part of the national Dying Matters initiative which promotes public awareness of dying, death and bereavement. Feedback was really positive and using Leeds Museum as a new location definitely brought a new audience to our talks.

In March we launched our new 2017-2018 hard copy Directory of Bereavement Services including over 80 local and national bereavement support organisations. We have distributed 1,000 copies across the city, including copies to every GP Practice in Leeds.
